Which of the the following is NOT a problem that Waltz raises for the first image:

- a. No balancing against the US has occurred since the end of the Cold War
- b. You have to reform human nature all over the world
- c. The independent variable stays the same, but the dependent variable changes
- d. Who does the reforming?
- e. You have to reform all people, not just elites

The Wars of the French Revolution gave rise to the idea that:

- a. Democracies cause war
- b. Capitalism causes war
- c. Human nature causes war
- d. Democracies don't go to war with each other
- e. The offense-defense balance affects the severity of the security dilemma
