

Some Windows and Mac Stuff

- Getting to MS Office and Excel
 - Installed on your PC/Mac
 - Through VPN to the Open Access Labs
 - Go to https://voal.tamu.edu/
 - Install the VMware Horizon Client for Windows or Mac
 - Open the Client, "Add Server" with address connect.voal.tamu.edu
 - It will prompt you to log in using your Net ID then go to VOAL to open a virtual Windows desktop



Windows File Explorer


- Windows file structure
 - Windows File Manager
 - Beware the Cloud
 - The default for most Windows installations is to save documents to the Cloud – OneDrive
 - If you save documents to the Cloud, you only have access to those documents when you have an active Internet connection
 - I HIGHLY recommend that you save files on your local drive by going to the Documents folder under "This PC" and creating new folders to organize your documents





Excel Defaults

- Similarly, the defaults in Excel are typically set to save to the Cloud
- In Excel, go to File, Options (at the bottom of the screen) and on the 'Save' tab, you can set the "Default local file location" to your Documents folder



Downloading Files

- I have fielded several questions regarding apparent problems downloading the Excel workbooks for class
- Most likely, this is due to default settings in your Internet browser set to automatically save files that cannot be displayed in the browser to a "Downloads" folder


Downloads

- I recommend that you set your browser defaults to prompt you for where you want to save downloads
- For example, in Chrome Settings, go to Downloads and turn on "Ask where to save each file before downloading"
- There should be similar settings in other browser software


Show downloads when they're done



Mac File Structure

- The Mac equivalent to Windows File Explorer is Finder
- I recommend that you go to the Documents folder on your Mac and create new folders to organize your documents





"ZIP" Files
